EXPRESSED STRONG INTEREST IN PROPOSAL SINCE IT WOULD HELP ENSURE REPATRIATION OF CANADIAN FUEL AND REDUCE CANADIAN EXPOSURE SHOULD IT TECHNOLOGY BE MISUSED. EXTAFF OFFICIALS UNDERTOOK TO MAKE POSITIVE RECOMMENDATION, BUT INDICATED THAT MINISTERIAL, AND POSSIBLY CABINET, DECISION WOULD BE REQUIRED.

- 2. IN FURTHER MEETING WITH EXTAFF ON JUNE 21, CANADIANS SAID THAT MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS JAMIESON HAD STRONGLY SUPPORTED AFFIRMATIVE CANADIAN RESPONSE, BUT QUESTION WAS STILL PENDING BEFORE SOME OF HIS CABINET COLLEAGUES.
