SUMMARY: (G,WF) THE RECENT COLOMBIAN SUPREME COURT DECISION WHICH
WILL SEE MILITARY PERSONNEL TRIED IN CIVILIAN COURTS FOR CERTAIN
CRIMES HAS CAUSED THE COLOMBIAN ARMY (COLAR) TO STOP ALL BLACK
PROPAGANDA PROGRAMS.

TEXT: 1. (G,WF) THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISION WHICH WILL SEE
MILITARY MEMBERS TRIED FOR CIVILIAN OR NON-DUTY-RELATED CRIMES HAS
LED THE COLOMBIAN ARMY (COLAR) TO STOP ALL BLACK PROPAGANDA
PROGRAMS. THE COLAR HAS ALWAYS HAD AN ACTIVE BLACK PROPAGANDA
PROGRAM. IT HAS BEEN THE RESPONSIBILITY OF BATTALION AND HIGHER
COMMANDERS TO DEVELOP PROGRAMS WITHIN THEIR UNITS, BASED ON THE
UNIT AREA SITUATION. OCCASIONALLY, HIGHER HEADQUARTERS HAVE
DEVELOPED REGIONAL PLANS FOR IMPLEMENTATION BY SUBORDINATE UNITS,
BUT THE NEW DECISION HAS LED THE COLAR TO STOP ALL BLACK PROPAGANDA

PROGRAMS, AS THEIR BEING TRACED BACK TO A MILITARY COMMANDER WOULD
NOW RESULT IN CIVILIAN CRIMINAL CHARGES.

2. (G,WF) AN EXAMPLE OF ALL THIS IS THE CASE OF LTC. NEJARDAS
(LONDONO) TAMAYO. LONDONO WAS THE BATTALION COMMANDER OF THE
COMPANY STATIONED OUTSIDE SEGOVIA. HE WAS RUNNING A BLACK
PROPAGANDA PROGRAM IN THE AREA JUST BEFORE THE SEGOVIA MASSACRE OF
8811. THIS PROGRAM WAS BASED ON THE THEORY THE FARC WAS COMING INTO
THE AREA TO KILL THOSE WHO HAD BEEN SUPPORTING THE ARMY. LONDONO
WAS INITIALLY BEING QUESTIONED IN THE SEGOVIA INCIDENT FOR
NEGLIGENCE IN HIS SUB-UNIT NOT PURSUING THE ASSASSINS. NOW, DUE TO
THE NEW SUPREME COURT DECISION, HE IS ALSO FACING CHARGES OF
TERRORISM, BASED ON HIS PROPAGANDA CAMPAIGN.
