From the Diary of Vitaly I. Vorotnikov

Dolgikh reported that early on the night of the 27th Moscow was informed that the accident was much more severe than according to the initial information. The reactor is damaged. The level of radioactivity is rising sharply. On the 27th the decision was made to evacuate residents of the NPS town of Pripyat. Units of civil defense and the Ministry of Interior were dispatched. Measures were undertaken to dump sand and lead on the reactor. [...]
