- 3. (LOU) THE UNDP DEPUTY, ASKED THE PURPOSE OF THE RAPPORTEUR'S VISIT, SAID ONLY THAT HE HOPED TO GET A BALANCED PICTURE OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWADA. THE AMBASSADOR IS SCHEDULED TO MEET THE TEAM APRIL 9.

- 4. (LOU) MEANWHILE, THE GOVERNMENT'S OFFICIAL RESPONSE TO THE REPORT OF THE INTERNATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION IS STILL PENDING. THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS DISCUSSED THE DRAFT REPORT (REFTEL) ALL DAY APRIL 2, WITH PRESIDENT HABYARIMANA IN THE CHAIR, AND AGAIN APRIL 6. SOURCES TOLD THE AMBASSADOR THAT THE MINISTERS ENGAGED IN A SERIOUS DEBATE, EVENTUALLY REJECTING THE DRAFT REPORT. ACCORDING TO ONE SOURCE, THE ISSUE BECAME NOT BLAME FOR WHAT ALL ACKNOWLEDGED HAD HAPPENED, BUT HOW TO ENSURE AGAINST REPETITION OF THE ABUSES. THE COUNCIL CHARGED THE PRESIDENCY AND THE PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE TO WORK TOGETHER TO REDRAFT THE REPORT TO REFLECT THE COUNCIL'S CONCERNS.
- 5. (LOU) COMMENT. UN INVOLVEMENT IN INVESTIGATING HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES IN RWANDA IS WELCOME. WE ARE SKEPTICAL THAT A ONE-WEEK VISIT WILL SUFFICE EITHER TO BALANCE OR COMPLETE THE WORK OF THE JANUARY INVESTIGATION.
- 6. (U) FOR GENEVA. WE WOULD APPRECIATE ANY ADVICE GENKVA MIGHT BE ABLE OFFER AS TO HOW EMBASSY/KIGALI

AND INTERESTED RWAND ASSIFIED INTEREST AND INVOLVEMENT OF THE UN HUMAN RIGHTS CENTER AND THE UNHRC IN THE HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION IN RWANDA. FLATEN
