

Good morning, ma'am. [REDACTED]. The purpose of this extended CUB topic is to provide an overview of our draft mission assessment framework.

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The purpose of the mission assessment framework is to establish repeatable, disciplined staff and command processes for assessment, in particular, to assess the current posture of USCYBERCOM forces against aligned effects.

A few things to note about the assessment framework overall:

- The framework itself is nested within the USCYBERCOM J35 plans playbooks and will contribute, when aggregated, to the assessment of the playbook options.
- Our intent was leverage, to the degree possible, existing processes and products (e.g., CUB slides, Executive Joint Collection Management Board dashboard that was briefed as part of the extended CUB last week, and Defense Readiness Reporting System (or DRRS) reporting. We are not trying to scrap everything and restart from the beginning.
- The assessment framework is currently on offensive cyberspace operations.
- Finally, we have briefed the initial concept to the USCYBERCOM DCDR and CoS.

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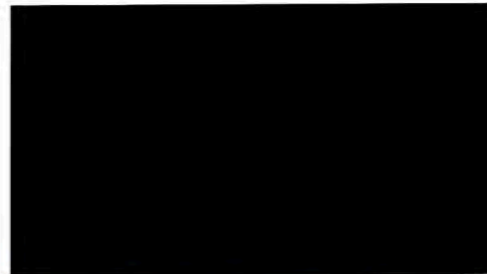
