The message received December 31 in reply to President Ford's letter to General Secretary Brezhnev of December 17 regarding the microwave signal directed at the US Embassy in Moscow indicates that the General Secretary is working from a different set of facts than is President Ford.

Therefore President Ford welcomes the proposal to have specialists from both sides get together. The President believes that the facts which will be presented by the US specialists will clearly show that two new transmitters have gone into operation in recent months in the immediate area of the US Embassy and are operating at a level and for a duration which poses a threat to the well-being of US personnel in Moscow.

President Ford appreciates the statement that there is no intention to pose a threat to the health and piece of mind of our people in Moscow, and believes that we can show the necessity of turning off the signals which are causing the problem. We will send our specialists to Moscow immediately for discussion with Soviet experts.
