MEMORANDUM FOR THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE

Subject: False Events (U)

- l. (S) As part of the verification testing of the nonoperational PAVE PAWS west site, simulation tests were conducted on 5 March 1980. A NORAD general officer was present
  during the test. Between 1910Z and 1940Z, two successful
  simulation tests were conducted. At 1944Z, another simulation
  tape was started and one simulated target was mis-correlated
  as a real target. This is not considered as a valid input
  since the site is non-operational. At 1945Z, NORAD convened
  a Missile Display Conference. A System confidence and
  NORAD confidence of "NO" were passed. Simulation conduct
  procedures and confidence reporting procedures were followed
  exactly as specified by directives and checklists. This
  event has been turned over to the contractor for detailed
  analysis and corrective action.
- 2. (S) On 6 March 1984, 1700-2300Z, a class A simulation test between DSP-E, NMCC, SAC, and NORAD was conducted with a NORAD general officer monitoring the test. All participants and users were briefed and notified 72 hours in advance. Test override lights were placed on in NORAD CC. Voice conference loop was established with all users. At 1900Z, Data Distribution Center (DDC) personnel directed Overseas Ground Station (OGS) personnel to throw a switch. The operator in Australia placed it in the wrong position and allowed test data to be transmitted as real. Because of the precautions described above, all concerned were immediately made aware of the problem. Following established procedures, NORAD convened a Missile Display Conference at 1904Z and a system confidence and NORAD assessment of "NO" were passed.

3. (S) In both cases, no reaction was taken by any military forces. The contractor will insert appropriate changes in software to preclude 5 March malfunction and procedural correction will be taken as a result of the 6 March test.

SUBJECT: NORAD Events - INFORMATION MEMORANDUM

- (S) In conjunction with the JCS we have conducted a preliminary investigation of the two NORAD events in which test data was inputted into the system as real data.
- (S) In the first case (5 March), PAVE PAWS West was undergoing IOT&E verification with a General Officer monitoring at NORAD. PAVE PAWS computer correlated a simulated target as a real target. This information was transmitted to NORAD. was immediately recognized as an error and a NORAD assessment of "NO" was transmitted.
- In the second case (6 March), DSP-E was involved in a test of the 427M system under the supervision of a General Officer. Because of an operator error at Buckley, the DSP station in Australia was incorrectly ordered to place a switch in a wrong position causing test data to be transmitted as real data. The error was recognized by the test team and a NORAD assessment of "NO" was transmitted.
- In both cases normal procedures and directives were followed. Missile Display Conferences (this is an internal conference) were initiated. No actions external to the NMCS system were taken.
- The good news is that the test procedures that have been established precludedany false alert. Also we can and will make procedural corrections and software changes to correct the two specific errors that occurred. However, I am still not convinced that we have done everything that can be done to prevent test data from being transmitted as real data. I have asked Gerry Dinneen to go to NORAD immediately (he is at Leavenworth today) to review the situation and recommend further corrective action. He will be at NORAD tomorrow and will give us a full report on the situation when he returns on Monday. William Jeleny
