#### INTRODUCTORY

Very grateful for this meeting considering circumstances.



President sends best wishes for your speedy recovery; wants to be directly in touch when you are better.

## U.S. Russia Relationship

- Have only one issue to discuss--President's wish that we overcome disagreement in Budapest. Two points:
- First, President wants you to know he remains strongly/personally committed to partnership with you.
- He reaffirmed this publicly in Miami on Sunday.
- -- He'll defend our policy and sustained economic aid in 1995 with Congress.
  - Trying to be helpful on Chechnya. ]
- Second, he believes strongly we must fund a way to seek an understanding and joint agreement on European security.
- Know now from Chernomyrdin/Kozyrev that there was a big misunderstanding on NAC decision.
- -- Want to assure you our policy is for a gradual, open process, as President told you in September.
- I know it could be complicating for you if NATO sought to move sharply forward on expansion in 1995 when you'll have parliamentary elections.
- 1995 will be year of study only: can assure you there is no timetable or negotiations for membership.

#### Want to Propose Way Forward

- U.S. and Russia must have closest possible understanding on this issue.
- Have agreed on Christopher-Kozyrev talks to begin in January.
