My dear General Groves;

HANFORD ENGINEER WORKS - CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE Referring to your letter of November 16, quoting two paragraphs from Mr. W. O. Simon's letter to you of October 29.

You, Sir, are no more disappointed than we of the du Pont Company, over the limitations which stringent Governmental controls of manpower have imposed upon the procurement of labor for this Hanford project. If one were to base any judgments upon the information developed yesterday from the telephone conference between Col. Barker of your office and our Construction Manager, F. H. Mackie, the prospects would seem to indicate that the completion dates may be even later rather than earlier than those given in the construction schedule of September 30. You will recall the statement given Col. Barker at the beginning of the month, that our schedules of completion were based upon securing some 9500 additional field employees between November 3 and December 8, and you directed us, in your letter of November 2 to Mr. G. M. Read, to follow instructions from the War Manpower Commission to secure this labor direct from the United States Employment Service, - a procedure which has resulted as of November 20, in adding not a single employee to the Hanford rolls.

You may be assured, General Groves, that this job will be completed at the earliest date possible, regardless of any previously suggested schedules, having in mind that at this date the lack of sufficient field labor is the cardinal limitation.

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to the super-cautious letter of Mr. W. O. Simon, Manager of Hanford Engineer Works, dated October 29, 1943. In this letter he said:

"The construction schedule indicated the date of completion of the first 100 Area to be about August 15, 1944, with the second and third Areas following at two months intervals. The schedule further indicated that the 200 Area is to be completed as early as they would be needed to handle materials for the 100 Areas.

"The construction schedule assumed that construction labor would be available at Hanford as needed. However, to date the War Manpower Commission has not made the necessary construction labor available. Consequently, the scheduled dates have been set back from one to two months. This has been made clear by Mr. Read's letters of October 4 and October 8 to General Groves. Furthermore, if the War Manpower Commission continues to be unable to supply construction labor at the required rate, additional delay will follow."

Apparently Mr. Simon had not been informed of my definite refusal to accept Mr. Read's "scheduled" completion dates.

I am still unwilling to accept such a setback and, on the contrary, am expecting that an organisation as competent and experienced as yours will beat the August date by an appreciable number of weeks.
