TOWN'S DEFENDERS CONCEDE THE FARC COULD DO WHENEVER THEY DECIDE IT IS IN THEIR INTEREST. WHEN THE JUNGLE WARFARE-TRAINED DIRAN POLICE LEAVE THEIR SANDBAGGED HEADQUARTERS TO CONDUCT COUNTER-NARCOTICS OPERATIONS, THEY MUST WALK; THEY HAVE JUST ONE TWIN-CAB PICK-UP TRUCK TO CALL THEIR OWN. NEITHER THE COPS NOR THE ARMY VENTURE ACROSS THE RIVER, WHERE AN ESTIMATED 500 FARC MILITIA CONTROL THE TIN-ROOFED SHACKS AND SLUMS THAT DOT THE FAR SIDE AND ARE HOME TO THE BULK OF THE "URBAN" POPULATION.
